3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Well-Informed, Sci5 entific, & Efficient Government Act of 2025" or the
6 "WISE Government Act".

1 SEC. 2. AGENCY JOURNAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.

2 (a) PROHIBITION ON NONDISCLOSURE PROVISION
3 FOR JOURNAL SUBSCRIPTIONS.—The head of an agency
4 may not enter into any contract for a journal subscription
5 that prohibits disclosure of the cost of the subscription to
6 another agency or the Library of Congress.

7 (b) EMPLOYEE ACCESS TO LIBRARY SUBSCRIP-8 TIONS.—Not later than 6 months after the date of the 9 enactment of this Act, the head of each agency shall re-10 quire that each library of the agency make easily and 11 clearly available to the employees of the agency, including 12 regional employees, through the intranet any policy or pro-13 cedure for employee access to a subscription of the library.

14 (c) Report on Increasing Access to Serials.— Not later than 12 months after the date of the enactment 15 16 of this Act, the Administrator, in consultation with the Library of Congress, the applicable agency libraries, and 17 other relevant stakeholders (including the Defense Tech-18 19 nical Information Center, the National Library of Medicine, the Education Resources Information Center, and 20 21 the National Technical Information Service) shall submit 22 to Congress and each agency library a report on increasing 23 agency library access to serials that includes—

(1) a survey of subscriptions purchased and
cost data for applicable agency libraries and the Library of Congress;

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1	(2) an outline of any issues with agency access
2	to scientific serials and subscriptions, which may in-
3	clude contract issues, concerns arising with new pub-
4	lishing media (including print, online, and aggre-
5	gated services), the ability of agency employees to
6	use agency library subscriptions in headquarters and
7	regional offices, purchasing system inefficiencies,
8	and price concerns; and
9	(3) recommendations on addressing issues, in-
10	cluding short-term and long-term solutions and as-
11	sessing the potential need for greater interagency
12	transparency and new purchasing models.
13	(d) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:
14	(1) Administrator.—The term "Adminis-
15	trator" means the Administrator of General Serv-
16	ices.
17	(2) AGENCY.—The term "agency" has the
18	meaning given that term in section 551 of title 5,
19	United States Code.
20	(3) Applicable agency library.—The term
21	"applicable agency library" means the libraries of—
22	(A) the Executive departments listed in
23	section 101 of title 5, United States Code;
24	(B) the military departments listed in sec-
25	tion 102 of title 5, United States Code; and

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(C) any agency with a scientific focus, in cluding the Environmental Protection Agency
 and the National Aeronautics and Space Ad ministration.
 (4) DIRECTOR.—The term "Director" means
 the Director of the Office of Management and Budg et.

8 (e) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in this sec-9 tion may be construed as requiring the disclosure of mat-10 ters that are otherwise not subject to disclosure under sec-11 tion 552(b) of title 5, United States Code (commonly re-12 ferred to as the Freedom of Information Act).
