Dear Members of Congress listed above:

This letter is in response to your June 9, 2017 letter regarding the President's Budget Request for FY 2018 and its potential implications for jobs at U.S. colleges and universities.

The National Science Foundation's FY 2018 Budget Request to Congress includes information pertinent to your inquiry. As summarized in the table below, NSF estimates that in FY 2018, approximately 130,000 senior researchers, other professionals, postdoctoral associates, and graduate and undergraduate students will be directly involved in NSF programs and activities, receiving salaries, stipends, participant support and other types of direct involvement. This is approximately 13,000 (9 percent) fewer people than were directly involved in NSF programs and activities in FY 2016. As these positions and people are employed by the universities and other institutions that receive NSF funding, we are not able to determine whether the jobs those people hold would be eliminated, or whether grantee institutions would have other resources available to support the positions.

Dear Secretary Perry, Dr. Collins, Administrator Pruitt, Dr. Córdova, Dr. Rochford, Acting Administrator Friedman, and Acting Administrator Lightfoot:

We write to you today to ask for information on the number of jobs that would be eliminated at our nation's universities and National Laboratories if the President's Budget Request (PBR) for Fiscal Year 2018 were to be enacted.

Our universities and National Laboratory system support a world-class workforce of research scientists, engineers, and support personnel who work as teams on long-term solutions to address some of the nation's greatest challenges. Moreover, our universities and National Labs play a unique and critical role in educating the next generation of American scientists and researchers, including thousands of graduate students and postdoctoral researchers at hundreds of U.S. institutions who depend upon federal funding and facilities for their research and training.

We recognize that we must set priorities and make smart, strategic decisions about federal funding. But we also have serious concerns about the priorities this Administration appears to be setting. From economic stagnation and dependence on foreign energy to curing diseases and addressing threats to our national security, scientific research is the foundation for the innovative solutions that will enable us to overcome many of our greatest challenges. Instead, the funding

levels requested in the FY18 PBR would cause permanent damage to our research infrastructure and workforce and furthermore force our National Labs to lay off critical scientific staff. This is no way to keep America great or maintain our position as a leader in science and innovation.

We cannot properly evaluate the full impact of the FY18 PBR until we know how many university researchers and National Laboratory employees would lose their federal funding or their jobs if these funding levels were enacted. Please provide your projections on how many researchers would be supported in the FY18 PBR compared to the current level as of the spring 2017. Also provide your estimates on how many National Laboratory employees would lose their jobs if these funding levels were enacted. We appreciate your detailed response no later than June 15, 2017.
